

In 2017 the East Africa Communications Organization (EACO) adopted a "Regional e-waste management strategy", developed by a dedicated task force under the EACO Working Group 10 through its Regional E-waste Management Steering Committee (RSC). The strategy has several goals, mainly the establishment and strengthening of the EACO regional e-waste management steering committee and the establishment and strengthening of national e-waste management steering committees and/or e- waste management technical working teams in each of the 5 EACO Member Countries (Burundi, Kenya, Rwanda, Tanzania and Uganda). This is all in the vision of "achieving zero negative impact of e-waste in EACO member states by 2030".

The strategy promotes the principle of Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) to finance proper collection and treatment of e-waste in the region. It also calls for harmonization of policies and legal frameworks in EACO member states, the establishment of regional infrastructure and easy trans-boundary movements of e-waste in the region.

This survey aims to map the current availability of national and regional infrastructures for formal e-waste collection and treatment in EACO countries. This will help identify the needs for infrastructure extension/regional or international collaboration. The survey was done by the Expert Pool created by GIZ (German Cooperation for International Cooperation) who are supporting the implementation of EACOs Regional E-waste management strategy.

All answers are collected, aggregated and made anonymous by the project coordinators before being discussed and disclosed.
